STU CLEANING STAFF LAID OFF

A number of you have been in touch with us regarding the layoff of cleaning staff at STU. Some of these workers have been at the university for fifteen to twenty years and they have developed personal relationships with many of us. In June, the contract for cleaning staff was awarded by STU to GDI Canada instead of Aramark. Unfortunately, it seems that GDI Canada does not work with unionized employees in any of their operations in New Brunswick. We are aware that some employees were offered interviews with the new company, and that some were re-hired, but not all.

FAUST is currently crafting a message to the Employer, expressing our displeasure that STU, a university with a "social conscience," has hired a company that does not work with unionized employees. We have also been informed that many workers have been laid off at UNB as well. We recognize the importance of frugality at a time like this, but not on the backs of long-serving workers.

UPDATE FROM PART-TIME FACULTY LIAISONS



As reported in our last issue, the FAUST Executive has created a **new position** entitled **Part-Time Faculty Liaison**, in recognition of the **special challenges** facing Part-Time faculty in the transition to remote teaching in the current COVID-19 environment. Since their appointment, our liaisons - **Janice Harvey** (Environment & Society) and **Mike Fleming** (Sociology & Criminology/Criminal Justice) – report having received many emails from Part-Time faculty in July and August, but that it has been quieter since the beginning of the semester. They wish to remind Part-Timers that their door is always open. In Mike Fleming 's words, if you encounter any challenges or difficulties, "please continue to keep us in the loop."

UPDATE FROM COALITION FOR POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION IN NB



representing students, staff and faculty in the province's colleges and universities. The coalition was formed to draw the attention of New Brunswickers to the state of post-secondary education in the province. The coalition argues that PSE is "an important and essential part of the solution for a prosperous New Brunswick, during and post-Covid pandemic."
